

DATA PROTECTION INFORMATION

OF THE FACULTY OF ENGINEERING AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY OF THE UNIVERSITY OF PÉCS POLLACK EXPO EVENT REGISTRATION

The University of Pécs (the University) pays particular attention to the fact that in its data management activities it complies with the provisions of Regulation 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council (EU) on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (GDPR, hereinafter referred to as the "General Data Protection Regulation"), the Hungarian Data Protection Act 2011. CXII of 2011 (hereinafter referred to as "Infotv."), other legislation and the data protection practices developed in the course of the activities of the National Authority for Data Protection and Freedom of Information (NAIH).

1. THE PURPOSE OF THE PROSPECTUS

The purpose of this notice is to provide information on the data protection and data management principles applied by the Data Controller to the User's personal data.

3. SCOPE OF PERSONAL DATA PROCESSED

The scope of the data processed includes the data provided during the registration for the Pollack Expo event in 2024, such as the User's name, telephone number and e-mail address. If any modification or change occurs in the User's data processed by the Data Controller during the period of data processing, the User must immediately notify the modification or change to the contact person Brigitta Balogh Dr. by e-mail to balogh.brigitta@mik.pte.hu.

4. PURPOSE AND LEGAL BASIS OF DATA PROCESSING

For the purpose of the registration of the Pollack Expo event in 2024, the Data Controller processes the personal data provided by the User during the registration process on the basis of the User's consent - Article 6 (1) (a) of the General Data Protection Regulation.

5. DURATION OF PROCESSING

Data will be processed until the end of the Pollack Expo event in 2024.

6. WHO HAS ACCESS TO THE DATA

Access to the data is restricted to staff of the University department whose staff need the data to perform their duties. Staff members are bound by confidentiality obligations with regard to the personal data they receive.

7. DATA SECURITY

The University shall ensure adequate security of the personal data of the data subject, including protection against unauthorised or unlawful processing, accidental loss, destruction or damage, by implementing appropriate technical and organisational measures. Further information on the data security measures applied by the University can be found in §§ 20-22 of the University of Pécs Data Protection Regulations and in the University's IT Security Regulations.

8. RIGHTS OF THE USER

8.1. The User shall have the right to access the information provided for in Article 15 of the General Data Protection Regulation in relation to the processing of personal data concerning him/her, including in particular the right to be informed by the Controller that.

- which personal data,
- for what purposes and on what legal basis,
- from which source collected,
- for how long it processes them; and
- to whom, when, under what law, to which personal data, to which personal data the controller has given access or to whom the controller has transferred the personal data, and
- what rights and remedies the User has in relation to the processing.

8.2. The User has the right to rectify or correct inaccurate (incorrect or incomplete) personal data relating to him/her pursuant to Article 16 of the General Data Protection Regulation.

8.3. The User shall have the right to withdraw his/her consent to processing based on consent at any time in writing without giving reasons, pursuant to Article 7(3) of the General Data Protection Regulation. The withdrawal shall not affect the lawfulness of the processing prior to the withdrawal.

8.4. The data subject has the right to erasure of his or her personal data pursuant to Article 17 of the General Data Protection Regulation (right to erasure) if.

- the personal data are no longer necessary for the purposes for which they were collected or otherwise processed;
- where processing is based on consent, the data subject withdraws his or her consent and there is no other legal basis for the processing;
- the data subject has effectively objected to the processing on the basis of 7.7;
- the personal data have been unlawfully processed;
- the personal data must be erased in order to comply with a legal obligation;

The data will not be erased if the processing is necessary

- for the performance of a legal obligation or in the exercise of a public task or authority;
- for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims;

for archiving purposes in the public interest, scientific or historical research purposes or statistical purposes, where the right to erasure would be likely to render such processing impossible or seriously jeopardise it.

8.5. The data subject has the right to request the restriction of the processing of his or her personal data as set out in Article 18 of the General Data Protection Regulation (right to restriction) if:

- the data subject contests the accuracy of the personal data, in which case the restriction shall apply for the period of time necessary to allow the University to verify the accuracy of the personal data;
- the processing is unlawful and the data subject opposes the erasure of the data and instead requests the restriction of their use; or

- the University no longer needs the personal data for the purposes of the processing but the data subject requires it for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

Personal data subject to restriction, except for storage, may be processed only with the consent of the data subject or for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims or for the protection of the rights of another natural or legal person or of an important public interest of the Union or of a Member State.

- 8.6. In the case of automated (electronic) processing based on consent or for the performance of a contract, the data subject has the right to receive personal data relating to him or her in a commonly used electronic format or to request the University to transfer the data to another controller, as defined in Article 20 of the General Data Protection Regulation (right to data portability).
- 8.7. The data subject may exercise his or her rights free of charge by contacting the contact person or the Data Protection Officer indicated in point 2. The exercise of the data subject's rights may in most cases require the identification of the data subject, while in some cases (e.g. exercising the right to rectification) it may require the verification of some additional data. The University will decide on the request to exercise the right of access within one month at the latest. Where necessary, taking into account the complexity of the request and the number of requests, this time limit may be extended by a further two months, the extension being notified to the data subject within one month.

9. THE USER MAY EXERCISE HIS/HER RIGHTS AT THE FOLLOWING CONTACT DETAILS

You can make any complaints regarding the processing of your personal data using the contact details provided in section 2 or by contacting the University's Data Protection Officer (adatvedelem@pte.hu). If you wish to make a complaint by post, you can do so to the address Vasvári Pál u. 4. 7622 Pécs, to the contact person indicated in point 1 or to the Data Protection Officer.

If you consider that you have suffered or are at imminent risk of suffering a legal damage in connection with the processing of your personal data, you may contact the National Authority for Data Protection and Freedom of Information (postal address: 1363 Budapest, Pf. 9. phone: +36 (1) 391-1400, email: ugyfelszolgalat@naih.hu, website: <https://naih.hu>).

In the event of a breach of your data protection rights, you may also take legal action before the courts of your place of residence or domicile, at your choice.
